What this course will provide: This course is designed to provide an overview of current practices and theory for heavy oil cold production. Course content will include:

- Production Engineering – drilling and completions, production practices, transportation and marketing;
- Reservoir Engineering – recovery mechanisms, field behaviour, modelling;
- When Cold Production Fails – problems and remediation, workover methods and stimulation options.

Who this course will benefit: This two-day course is for technical and operations staff with heavy oil producers and service companies looking for an introduction to reservoir and production issues involved in the cold production recovery process.
